Beginning 7:30am on Monday, August 20, at Gleneagles Country Club, men and women of all ages are invited to play a course that benefits others.

Proceeds will benefit the synagogue's Youth Scholarship Program, which helps its children attend Jewish summer camps, leadership development programs, Israel experiences, Gap-Year programs and the March of the Living tour. The Classic will also provide participants the opportunity to donate non-perishable food items for the **North Texas Food Bank**, to which a financial contribution will also be made.
